As you might know S.M.A.R.T are the rules that we use for E-safety. Well, in case you forgot what S.M.A.R.T stands for, I'm here to remind you.



S stands for safe: Being safe on the internet is very important. One of the things you mustn't do is give away any of your personal information. Your personal information is your full name, your address, phone number, postcode and your username and password. This doesn't mean you can't have fun on online websites, so long as you know who you are chatting with. (parents, relatives and friends.)



M stands for meetings: When you are online you must never agree to meet up with anyone unless you know who they are. Meeting up with someone you only know online. Only meet up with someone you know or if your parents/carer has given you permission. you must remember that online friends are still strangers even if you have been talking to them for a long time.



A stands for accepting: Opening messages, texts, images or folders from people you don't know or trust can lead to problems. They may contain nasty messages, inappropriate pictures or viruses. If you ever get sent a message like this, then don't open it. Go to an adult you trust to show them and talk about it. Then you must delete it immediately.



R stands for reliable: Someone on the internet can't always be who they say they are. They may also post fake information, so it's always good to check another website for information. If that website doesn't help then look in a book or ask a friend or family member who knows a lot about the subject.



T stands for tell: If something happens to you on the internet, you must tell an adult or guardian you trust. You must never try to solve the problem yourself unless you know what you are doing.
